C4HCO Updates  -COVID Special Enrollment Period  -Tracking updates from the CARES Act and Unemployment Benefits -Leg. Session on recess, Exchange will continue to support Easy Enrollment.	Finishing COVID SEP strong, about 12,000 medical submissions so far.  In the CARES Act, UI benefits count for eligibility for APTC but not for Medicaid.  SCOTUS ruling that 12 Billion will go back to carriers, and implications.  Bill Exchange is still monitoring: Easy Enrollment: CCLP working bill to gather information on tax forms for enrollment.	Group had questions about churn between Health First and Exchange. Since the public health emergency, Medicaid has stopped churning but this could be an area of focus for future after emergency ends.  Group wanted to know the Demographics of the 12,000 enrolled in the SEP so far, Exchange staff will be looking into that after the SEP has ended.  Easy Enrollment bill: It would open a SEP for this population.

Strategic Goals- MVB	Exchange staff is bringing the Strategic Goals to the group.  We are keeping the same four goals, but the objectives of each goal are subject to change.	Group supported thoughts about new or adjusted strategies - probably under Goal 2 - that may be relevant because of COVID.  Goal 2, increasing enrollment, and whether prioritizing improved data exchange with HCPF (and other processes too, potentially) would help bring in the large number of Coloradans under 200% FPL who remain uninsured.  Obj 3, goal 4: How we are changing with COVID, how doctors are delivering telehealth, we need to be prepared for the new world. Carriers, rural communities have limited care providers. Transfer from rural to front range. Increased importance in provider networks for customers. Real example of lower. Network issues on the specialty providers  Group was emphasizing the relevance of goal 2, objective 1 – new outreach to educate. And affordability.  Affordability should be a main focus in the new reality after COVID. Goal 3, objective 1, strategy 3 - include out of pocket costs- Cost big
